 - Use the “Check if I should apply” tool to discover if you qualify for government benefits, and apply for food, cash, and medical assistance programs
 - Programs include SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program), TANF (Temporary Assistance for Needy Families — temporary financial/medical assistance for pregnant women and families with children), AABD (Aid to the Aged, Blind, and Disabled), and Medicaid
