Featured Electronic Resource – A to Z Maps Online

Do stories of pirates on the high seas or devastating earthquakes in faraway lands ever send you reaching for an atlas? Have you ever dreamed of traveling cross-country or heading abroad? Desperately need a way to engage your junior high student in his or her homework? The Wood Dale Public Library now offers a free tool that can help with all those needs or simply indulge those who love poring over maps. Patrons now can access over 146,000 maps and supplemental materials online. All of Wood Dale Library's patrons can download and use the tens of thousands of maps in any way they wish, so long as the map is not resold.

Entertaining and educational, A to Z Maps Online is a valuable teaching tool with 2,700 fullcolor flag images and icons, 300 geography crossword puzzles, 267 geography lesson plans, 30 interactive geography games, and quizzes. A to Z Maps Online is accessible at the library or through the Internet. From our website, www.wooddalelibrary.org click on Electronic Resources, then click on Online Databases, then click on A to Z Maps Online. After logging in with your Wood Dale Library card and PIN, you may view, print or download any of the maps or supplemental material included in this resource.
