The Wood Dale Library Community Has Spoken!

In December, patrons filled out a library survey. In response to your collective input, the Library is excited to offer new services this summer.



A new early literacy computer lab is located in Youth Services. Freegal, a new downloadable music service, provides our patrons greater access to music collections. A majority of patrons indicated only having a date due receipt is fine, as long as date due stampers are available for their personal use, so date stampling will transition on July 1. Scanning and printing is easier with the installation of wireless printing and SimpleScan.

Finally, a significant parking lot rehabilitation project will begin in August. Patrons should see an improvement in parking lot design, paving surfaces, sidewalks and a new outside book drop. Beginning in August, please check our website daily for up-to-date library hours before visiting the Library, since access to the Library may be impacted at times due to construction.

Early Literacy Station

An early educational workstation specifically designed for children ages 2 through 10. With over 60 educational programs in either English or Spanish and a kid friendly menu that "knows" how to speak to the child in either language, this new lab is sure to help your child succeed in school or to just have some fun!

SimpleScan: Scan, Save, & Share

The SimpleScan Station makes scanning, saving and sharing as easy as 1,2,3. Now you can scan, save and even edit important documents and school papers. You can print your scanned documents on the Library's print system (\$0.10 for b&w, or \$0.25 for color). You can scan to a usb drive, or email yourself or others. Supported formats are jpeg, tiff, pdf, spdf, Word, or html.

Library Programs and Services

Wireless Printing: Coming Soon

Do you use your laptop at the Library? The Library now has wireless printing available to patrons using their own laptops. You can now send your print jobs to the Library's print station. B&W printouts are \$0.10 and color printouts are \$0.25. Look for the wireless printing icon on our webpage for wireless printing in the Library.

Freegal: Free Music Downloads!

The Library now freegal offers free MP3 music file downloads Popular DRM Free Music on its website through Freegal Music.

Freegal Music, an online database, provides access to songs from Sony Music. The music files are DRM-free, do not expire and are compatible with PC's, Macs, iPods, iPads, and other MP3-compatible devices. All Wood Dale Library cardholders are eligible for three MP3 downloads per week. Your library card number and PIN are necessary to access and download songs.

BookVenture – Fantasy



By Royal Decree—there is still time to register for summer reading and summer programs! Fairies, dragons, knights & nobles will inhabit the Library this summer.

Kids and teens may still register in the Youth Services Department or online. Readers will keep track of the time they spend reading by coloring in a box on their reading log for every 15 minutes that they read, are read to, or that they read to anyone else. Readers will be asked to record one title for every five hours read. If you read more than one picture book in a given hour, you can choose your favorite. If you are reading chapter books, it's okay to put the same title down more than once. Readers who read more than their goal earn a raffle ticket for every five additional hours they read and may choose their raffle prize entry.



Adults may register at the public service desk and receive a prize. Read or listen to books or periodicals; watch a "special display" DVD to participate in "A Midsummer Knight's Read." Read, listen or watch to complete your reading log and receive another prize.

Thursday, July 7 at 7 p.m.


Chris McBrien is Going Medieval on Reading at the Library! This is your chance to laugh out loud, enjoy some magic and talk to a dragon this summer.
