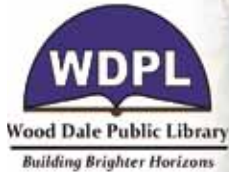

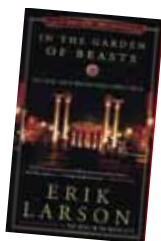
Books, Books, and More Books

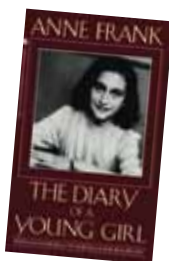
***In the Garden of Beasts: Love, Terror, and an American Family in Hitler's Berlin* by Eric Larson**

The world's best-known memoir of the Holocaust follows Anne Frank and her family in Holland during World War II. The family hid from the Nazis for two long years in a Secret Annex at the back of a warehouse, before they were found and sent to concentration camps. 🍷

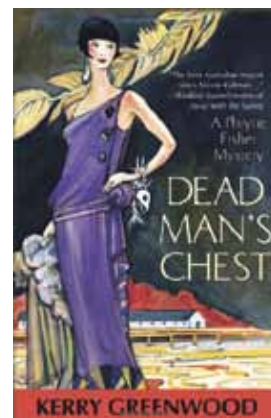
BookVenture – True Adventure

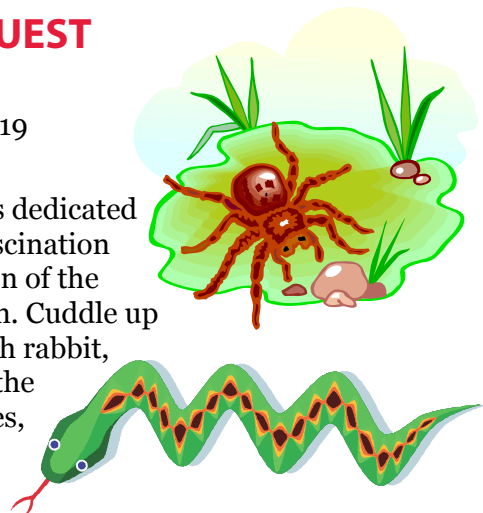


ANIMAL QUEST
