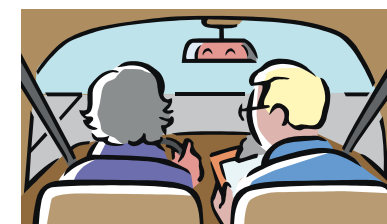

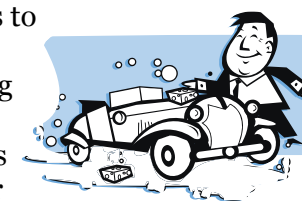


Auto Detailing

Adult Computer Classes

Introduction to Word

Saturday, May 5 10:30 am—Noon



Learn to use Word's basic toolbars, menus and commands to create, format, save and print documents. Features of Word 2010 will be practiced in this hands-on class.

Word Special Topics

Saturday, May 19 10:30 am —Noon



Practice making colorful flyers, multi-columned newsletters, stationary and labels with Word 2010. Learn to insert graphics from files and online clip art collections. Mail Merge will be used to print labels and form letters.

Introduction to Excel

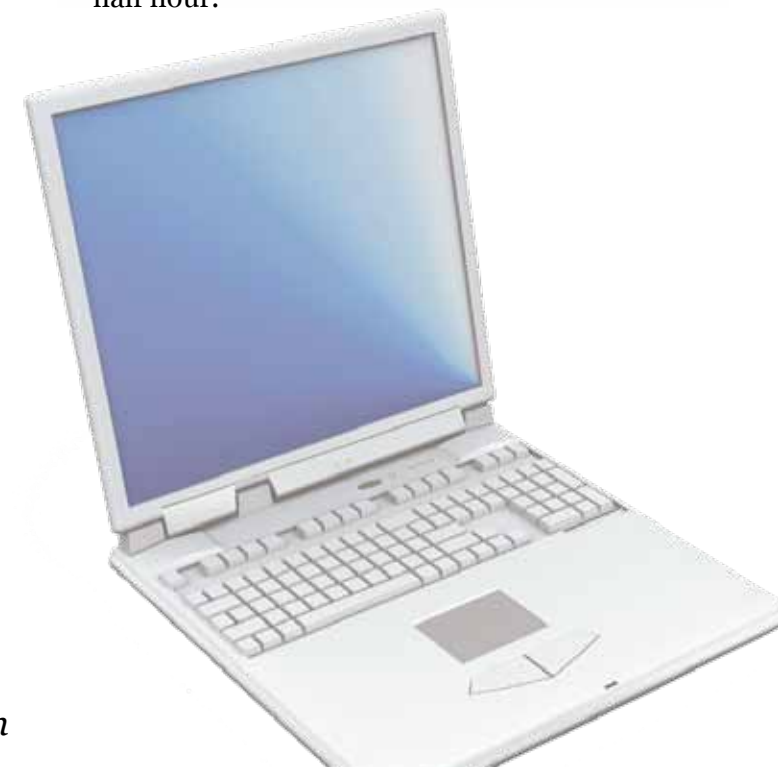
