


The Good Girl's Guide to Getting Lost By Rachel Friedman

This remarkable PBS documentary is the true story of a 26 year old African Prince, Abdul Rahman, who was captured and brought to America as a slave in 1788.






Islamic Art: Mirror of the Invisible World


