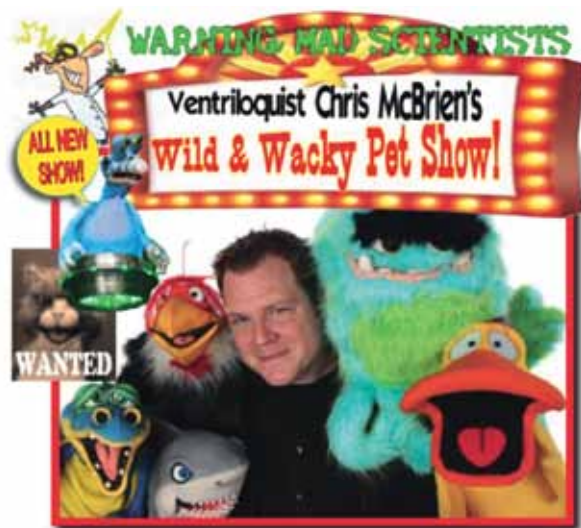
PUPPETS & MAGIC WITH MAGGIE ERDMANN
