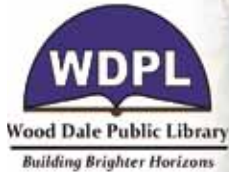

Celebrate Cinco de Mayo Early

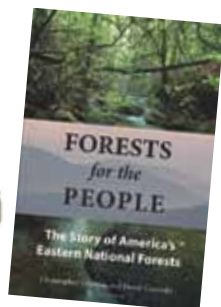
Friday, May 2 at 7 pm

Diabetes Management

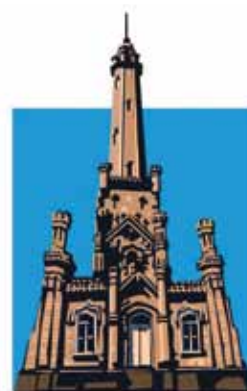
