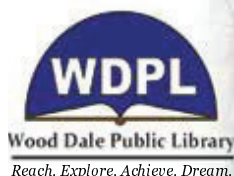

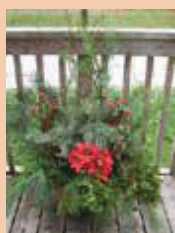

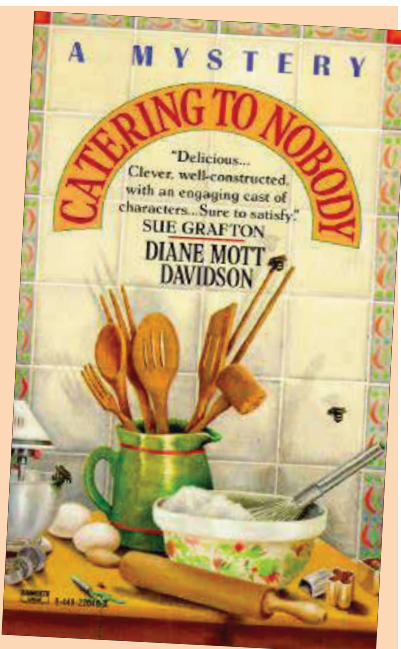
The Wood Dale Library will show an adaptation of James Ellroy's recently-discussed best-selling novel. Come, watch, and compare to the book. 🍷

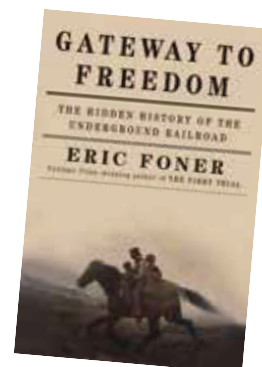


History Pages Book Discussion

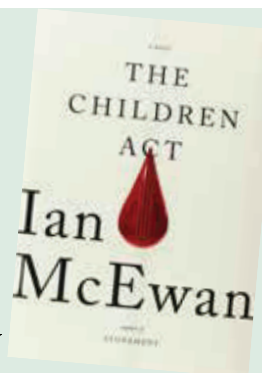

We recommend checking out Flipster, an online magazine service or hoopla, an entertainment service that offers viewing and listening selections.

Flipster

Flipster has many magazines for you to enjoy without having to return them to the Library or purchasing them from your favorite store. Just imagine not having that pile of magazines on your coffee table. You can view the online versions whenever you like on your favorite device. Current issues of Food Network, for that new appetizer recipe, or Flea Market Décor, for those eclectic holiday decorating ideas. HGTV, Craft Ideas, or Real Simple suggest many ideas to simplify the season, and are just a few of the selections. As an added bonus, you can look at last year's magazine too. There is a wealth of holiday ideas right at your fingertips.



hoopla

hoopla, another entertainment service that the Library offers, has movies, ebooks, audiobooks, music, TV shows, and comics. Are you looking for the perfect holiday read, are you in the mood for a holiday movie or do you want to keep the kids occupied with a holiday classic? You can download or stream 15 items per month to your favorite device.



Do you have a smart TV or are you planning to purchase one? The Library offers cables that you can borrow to connect your device and smart TV allowing you to watch your favorite movie on your smart TV.

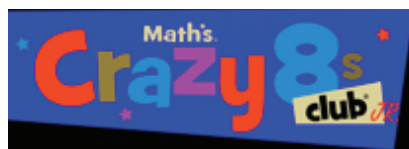

eResources for eBooks & More!

Winter Break and nothing to do? Let us suggest checking out an eBook from one of these collections. No matter your age you will be able to find an eBook or eAudio Book that will capture your imagination and make the time fly.



TumbleBooks is an online collection of TumbleBooks – animated, talking picture books which teach kids the joy of reading in a format they'll love. TumbleBooks are created by adding animation, sound, music and narration to existing picture books in order to produce an electronic picture book which you can read, or have read to you.



AudioBookCloud.com allows you to listen to your favorite audio books with just a click of a button. Listen online to audio books in many different categories: fiction, non-fiction, classics and even Spanish language audio books! There are 1,000 books in the collection and we're always adding more! These books are always available, never on hold, and no need to download. Browse. Click. Listen. It's that easy!



TumbleBookCloud is a collection of videos and chapter books in categories which include: eBooks, Read-Alongs, Graphic Novels, Videos (from National Geographic), and Audio Books suitable for middle school and high school grades.



Axis360 is a digital media platform, providing libraries and their patrons with a state-of-the-art system for circulating digital eBooks from the eReadIllinois shared collection for Illinois libraries. eReadIllinois supports a number of devices including iPad, iPhone, Android, Windows, NOOK® and Sony Reader™ devices, and many more.



Scholastic BookFlix is an online literacy resource that pairs classic video storybooks with related nonfiction eBooks from Scholastic to build a love of reading and learning. For children in grades PreK - 3.



FreedomFlix is an online resource that features dynamic eBooks that include embedded popup features such as primary source videos and audio clips, dramatic readings of letters and first-hand accounts, virtual tour clips, and more for students in grades 4-up.



ScienceFlix is comprised of 30 units spanning the full scope of curricular science topics including Earth Science, Space Science, Life Science, Health & Human Body, Physical Science, and Technology & Engineering, with a number of features designed to help students at all levels build and acquire the knowledge they need to be successful.



TrueFlix™ is an online resource that focuses on engaging subject-area content in science and social studies for students spanning grades 3-6.



Hundreds of new books can now be checked out from the comfort of your home. This service allows Wood Dale Library patrons to download eBooks to their computer, tablet, or eBook reader to read. The service also has audio books available to download and play on your pc, mp3 player or you can burn them to cd for listening.
