Building a Greater Library

The Wood Dale Public Library District strives to serve as a valued community resource for our residents. This upcoming fiscal year, the Library begins a building program to repair and update our original 1981 facility including an addition to transform our programming space to serve our residents better. A huge thank you to all of our residents who completed library surveys during the past several years. We've listened and hope the proposed enhancements better meet community needs, while retaining our welcoming and cozy feel! Below is a list of improvements:

- An expanded Youth Services Program Room to better serve Youth and Adult programming with flexible walls that open for enjoyment by the public when programs are not in session.
- A "Tween Area" featuring dedicated seating, collection space, and computer lab.
- An updated Early Learning Area where play and exploration help build early literacy skills.
- Three new small-group study rooms, integrating technology and furniture to bring people and information together for greater learning and collaboration.
- New furniture and seating with options for study, conversation and reading.
- Additional restroom facilities in the Youth Services area including a family restroom and a quiet room that can serve as a nursing room or low sensory space for children with special needs.
- Updating or replacing many original 1981 building systems at or beyond their end of life including electrical and plumbing.
- Improved lighting, new carpeting and data wiring and more!

Chicago World's Fair **Classic Foods** Friday, July 13 at 7 pm




