Using Your Library Just Got Better!

On May 1, the Wood Dale Public Library joined the SWAN library automation network. Patrons now have easy borrowing privileges at 97 libraries with access to almost 10 million items. There are more books, audiobooks, movies, TV shows, music, and special collections for you to enjoy.

How do I access these materials?

Using the Online Catalog in the Library or on our Website: SWAN uses the same library catalog, but it may look a little different. You can log into "My Account" and place holds for library material from other libraries and select your "Pick-Up Location" using your library card number and PIN. If you had a numeric PIN in the MAGIC library account, your PIN transferred into the SWAN network. The system could not transfer alphanumeric PIN numbers, so your PIN number defaulted to the last four digits of your telephone number in your library account. If you need assistance accessing your account or need to reset your PIN, please call the Library at 630.766.6762 and press 0 for assistance

Visiting Other Libraries: Your card is now registered at 97 libraries. When visiting other SWAN Libraries, please bring your library card to checkout material. Your library account must be current and in good standing (which means no outstanding fees or overdue materials). Please Note: Material checked out at the Wood Dale Library is fine free. Material checked out when visiting other libraries is subject to their policies.





How do I get notified about my library account and library material?

Email notification is the #1 way to keep track of all your account activity: hold pickups, hold cancellations, overdues and billing, courtesy notices, and auto-renewals. Notifications are also available in Polish and Spanish.

If you opt not to receive email notifications, there is an automated telephone system that contacts you about hold pickups, overdues and billing.

If you prefer text message notifications, you can select to receive hold pickups, overdues and billing, and/or courtesy notices. If you used our former "Shoutbomb" text messaging service, you can sign-up for the new text messaging service by going into "My Account" and selecting "Set Up Text Messaging."

Paper mail service for notices is limited to overdues and billings, and is utilized only if a patron has not selected to receive email, text, or phone notification.

How do I access Wood Dale Library databases?

Your library card and PIN number continues to be used for accessing Wood Dale Library databases. SWAN uses a different software program for connecting to these databases so while looking a little bit different, it still works the same way.

Thank you for your patience during this project. We hope you enjoy the expanded access to library material!
