Children from birth to their first day of Kindergarten will foster a love of reading while gaining the valuable pre-literacy skills that are so essential to reading success. Readers will receive a book bag and a sticker when they turn in their first 100 books logged. They will then receive a book for each additional 100 books logged. Titles can be repeated, and if you save your checkout receipt, you can tape it into the logbook.

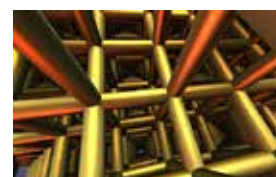
