


## Mystery Lovers' Pizza Night


The Library Book tells the story of the 1986 fire that destroyed 700,000 books in the Los Angeles Public Library and reflects on the past, present, and future of libraries in America.




### The Ghost Army: Conning the Third Reich

Arrive back at the library at 1:00 pm Saturday, August 24 and watch a movie with your stuffed animal. Families will receive copies of photos at that time.


