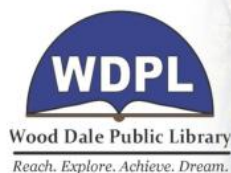

***The Namesake* by Jhumpa Lahiri**

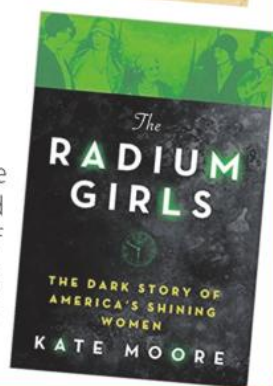
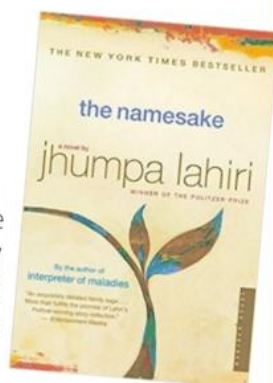

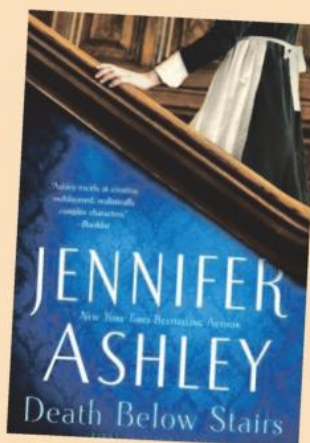
The Radium Girls is about the inspiring young women exposed to the "wonder" substance of radium, and their awe-inspiring strength in the face of almost impossible circumstances.

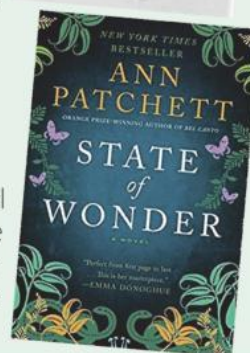

This provocative and assured novel of morality and miracles, science and sacrifice is set in the Amazon rainforest. Pick up a copy at the Library Book Club Kiosk.

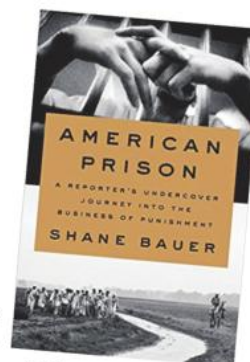

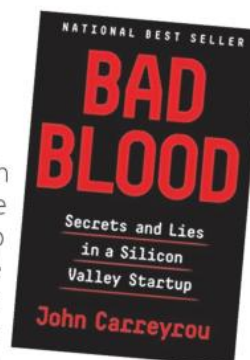
A blistering indictment of the private prison system and the powerful forces that drive it, *American Prison* is a necessary human document about the true face of justice in America.



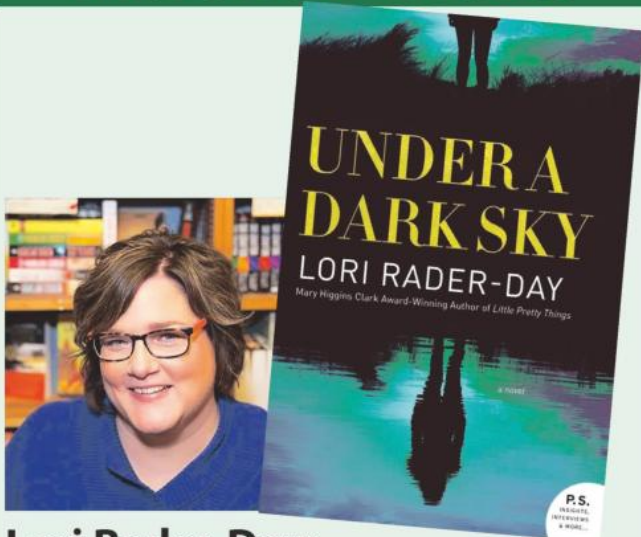
***Bad Blood: Secrets and Lies in a Silicon Valley Startup* by John Carreyrou**

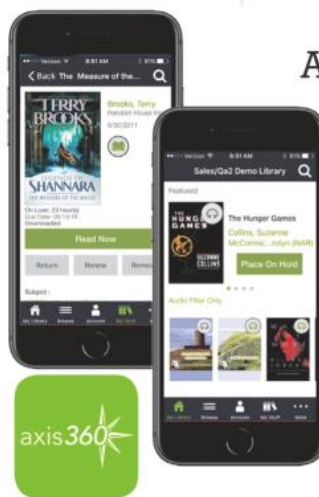

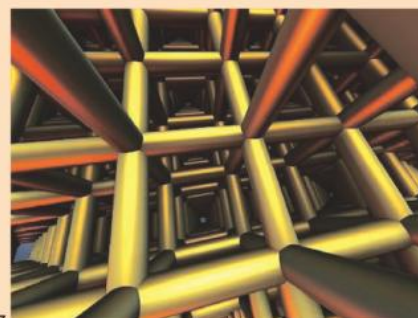

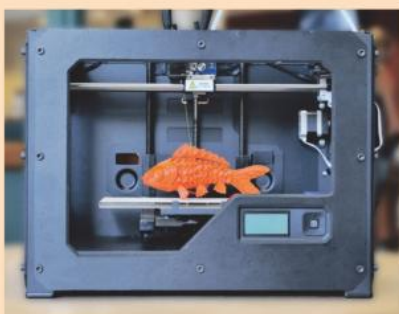
3D PRINTING FOR TEENS

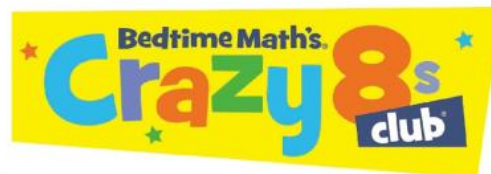

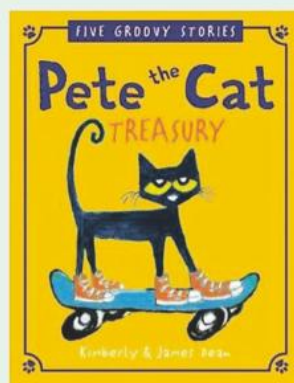
