### Check Out a Mobile Hotspot

The library circulates four mobile hotspot devices that will allow patrons to have Wi-Fi access anywhere in the United States wherever there is Sprint coverage. Each hotspot comes with a charger cord with plug, instruction sheet and carrying case. Up to 5 devices can use the hotspot at any one time. Hotspots are kept behind the Front Desk, so please ask staff if you would like to check one out. There may be a wait for one so place a hold today!

#### What is Explore More Illinois?

Explore More Illinois is a free service provided by your library that provides instant online access to free and discounted tickets to museums, science centers, sporting events, zoos, park districts, theatres, and other fun and local cultural venues. Explore More Illinois is free and can be accessed 24/7 from any computer, tablet, or smartphone.

#### How do I get a Pass?

Visit the Explore More Illinois homepage at exploremoreillinois.org. Log in with your library card credentials and browse for passes by date or attractions. If you do not know your PIN or password, please contact us. Make your reservation and print or download your pass shortly before your visit. You can have two active reservations per library card. Please cancel your reservation(s) if unable to attend, otherwise the reservation will count as being used. Remember that once you print or download your pass you cannot cancel your reservation.
