

Join Alice on her trip down the rabbit hole. Not just for kids, this classic can be interpreted on many levels.




Gilead by Marilynne Robinson Tuesday, April 21 at 7 pm




A dazzling, profound novel about a small town with a big dream—and the price required to make it come true.

The First Wave by Alex Kershaw Wednesday, April 29 at 7 pm


Beginning in the predawn darkness of June 6, 1944, The First Wave follows the remarkable men who carried out D-Day's most perilous missions.
