Master File Complete is a collection of full text articles from magazines, academic journals, reference books and primary documents. This database also includes images, videos, maps and more! A great starting place for any research project.



Points of View Reference Center™

Points of View Reference Center is a resource for students designed to help develop critical thinking skills. It includes articles, essays, overviews and more on an extensive range of topics.



Middle Search® Plus

Middle Search Plus focuses on material for middle school students, including full text articles from magazines, newspapers and more. There are also pictures and videos designed for use by middle school students.




Primary Search®




BOOKS, BOOKS & MORE BOOKS




Malorie by Josh Malerman (2nd in the Bird Box series)


