The Transformation Project repaired and replaced critical infrastructure of our original 1981 facility and included an addition to better support library initiatives so the community can Reach, Explore, Achieve, and Dream. We appreciate your patience during this project and can't wait to see you in person.

Due to COVID-19 and finalizing construction details, we're planning a grand opening celebration in the Spring. Please stay tuned for further details.

Improvements include:

- An expanded Programming Area to better serve Youth and Adult programming with flexible walls that open for use by the public when programs are not in session
- · A "Tween Area" featuring dedicated seating and collection space
- Three new-small group study rooms integrating technology and furniture to bring people together
- New furniture and seating with options for study, conversation, and reading

- · Additional ADA restroom facilities in the Youth Services area including a family restroom
- Additional parking with new LED lighting
- Outdoor patio for programming
- ADA accessible front door: new tile and carpeting
- Updated many of the original 1981 buildings systems including energy efficient lighting, HVAC systems, roof, emergency lighting, and sprinkler system.
