It's been wonderful to see Library patrons and to hear positive feedback as they step into the library for the first time. We're excited to announce the remodeled library construction project is nearing an end, as the front of the library is very close to being finished.

Before we can open the entire transformed library, we will need to close for a few weeks to re-install shelving, bring items back from storage, re-organize the entire collection, and install new furniture and shelving. The tentative closing timeframe is between mid-September and mid-October. 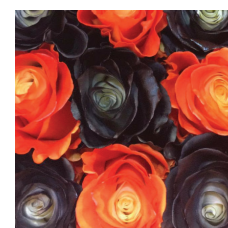

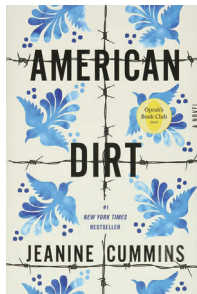

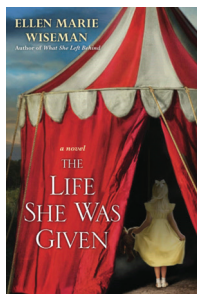
BOOKS, BOOKS & MORE BOOKS

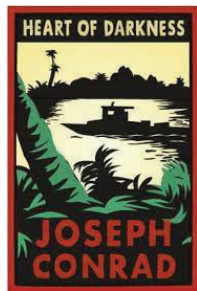

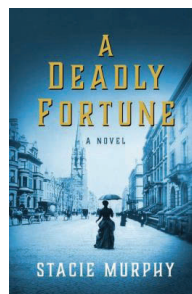
The Life She Was Given by Ellen Marie Wiseman

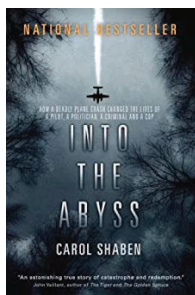

In this electrifying history, Canadian journalist Shaben chronicles a devastating plane crash and its ramifications on the four survivors.

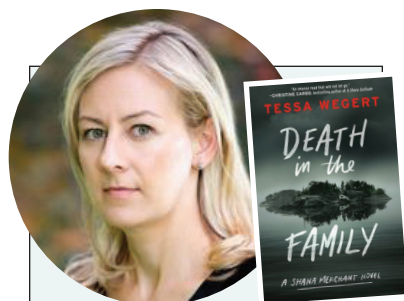

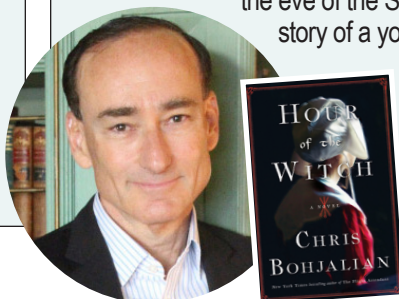

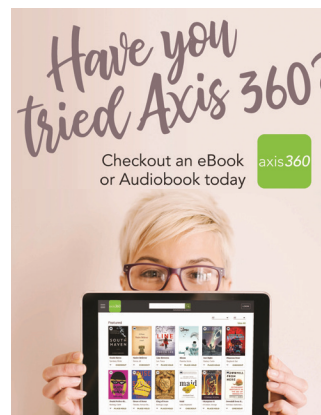

Mondays, September 13 & October 18

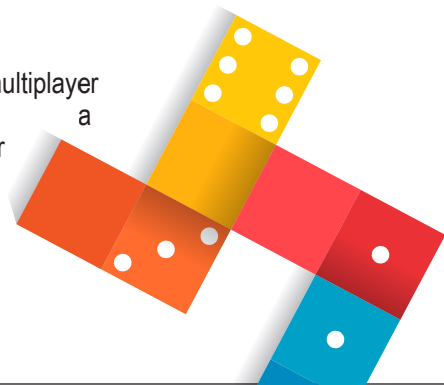

Join us on Zoom for an online, multiplayer version of Mexican Train, a dominos strategy game. Register online to receive the Zoom link and the game link.

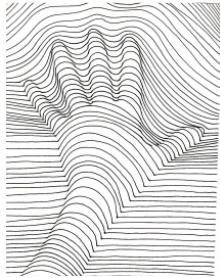
