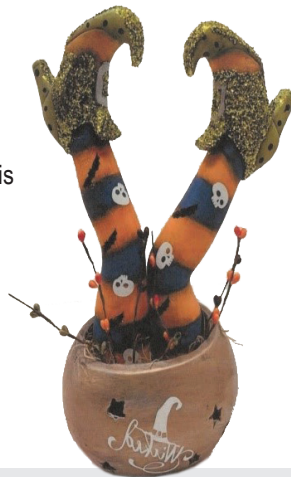


Crafts with Gilda: Ceramic Witches Legs

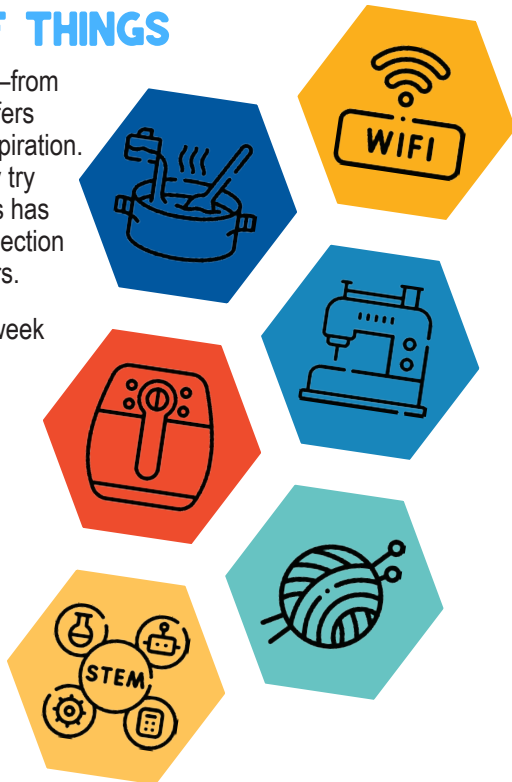
Coming Soon! LIBRARY OF THINGS

READ BEYOND THE BEATEN PATH Summer Reading at WDPL

Studies have shown that children lose significant knowledge over their summer break, as much as 20% in reading and 27% in math. Because younger children are in a crucial stage in their development, they are more likely to experience learning loss. The Wood Dale Library's summer reading program is designed to slow that slide. We encourage children to read material that they choose, enabling them to gain fluency and enjoyment from reading. Many of our craft and activity programs include elements of math, engineering, and science. These activities allow them to explore concepts in a fun environment while keeping their academic skills in practice.

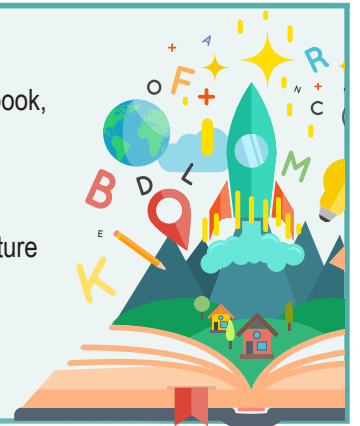
