MAYOR'S LETTER

Dear Wood Dale Residents,

As we approach the end of another year, I'd like to take a moment and reflect on the many improvements made in the community.

One example includes completing the Public Works Facility Improvement Project. The project officially broke ground in February 2022. It included renovating two existing facilities, constructing a new vehicle storage building, salt dome, material storage bins, and associated site work. The project cost approximately \$16 million and, due to its location and use, was able to be entirely funded by the Industrial TIF district. Significant funds (nearly 50%) were saved by renovating existing facilities instead of building from scratch. The renovations allow the City to bring the Administrative, Streets, Water Utilities, and Vehicle Maintenance

Divisions all within the same complex and provide updated amenities for 31 full-time staff members.

The City celebrated the completed project with a Ribbon Cutting/Open House event on September 7. Approximately 200 people joined the City Council, staff, and various partnering agencies to enjoy food, touch-atruck, various vendors, and kids' activities. We thank all those who attended.

The City also recently hosted the 13th annual Green Fair. With each Green Fair event, we assist residents with safely shredding documents in a secure fashion to prevent identity theft. We also collected nearly 10,000 lbs. of electronics recycling and diverted two, 30-yard dumpsters of older, non-functional electronics from landfills. This diversion from the landfill also prevents toxic chemicals from leaching into the soil,

polluting the groundwater and the air.

The Green Fair event is made possible by the support of several sponsors and the planning efforts of the Wood Dale for a Greener Tomorrow Committee. The Committee exists to protect, sustain and improve a healthy environment to benefit present and future generations of Wood Dale.

This holiday season, we continue to encourage green initiatives, by collecting old or

nonfunctioning holiday lights through January 29 at Public Works, and eyeglasses and tattered American flags ongoing at City Hall. We also encourage residents to drop off their expired prescription medicine. If you missed this opportunity at the Green Fair, know that the City maintains a RxBox for disposing of the medication safely at City Hall all year long. By dropping off unused medication, we prevent possible household poisoning and drug abuse. We also protect our environment. The medications will be incinerated in collaboration with the Illinois EPA using state-of-the-art technology. The medications will not be reused in any way.

Caring for our community does not stop there. We continue to build a relationship with S.C.A.R.C.E. (School & Community Assistance for Recycling and Composting

Many items marketed as disposable and/or flushable do not degrade like toilet paper, and end up clogging pipes and tangling pumps. They can also cause messy sewer backups that spill onto streets or even businesses and homes.

WHAT NOT TO FLUSH

• Vitamins, medicines or pharmaceuticals (these could be securely dropped off at the Wood Dale Police Department through the Drug Disposal Program)

- Diapers (cloth, disposable, or "flushable")
- Facial tissue
- Baby wipes, disinfectant wipes, etc.
- Toilet bowl scrubs pads
- Napkins or paper towels
- Dental floss
- Fats, oils and greases
- Sanitary napkins, tampons, condoms
- Wash cloths, towels, rags or cloth items
- Plastic wrappers or packaging
- Any NON-organic material

WHAT CAN I DO?

- Only flush human waste and toilet paper.
- Avoid purchasing "flushable" items.
- Compost your food waste.
- Discard hazardous material such as motor oil, antifreeze, etc. properly.
- If it can't be reused, recycled or composted, place it in the garbage.

Let's Keep Cooking Oil Out of The Sink

The City's Wood Dale for A Greener Tomorrow Committee is excited to partner with SCARCE to bring a cooking oil drop-off location to Wood Dale! The collected cooking oil is then recycled into biodiesel.

The drop-off location is on the south side of the Public Works building at 720 N Central Avenue. There is a bin where citizens may drop off oil containers.

Grease and cooking oil do not belong in residential drains. Even if hot water is running and grease is liquid when it goes down the drain, cooking oils and fats solidify when they reach cold pipes. Cities and homeowners spend thousands of dollars on resulting sewer clogs. Additionally, refuse containers are for solid waste only, so what's a person to do?

Recycle your used cooking oil and turn it into biodiesel! Save your vegetable cooking oil in a container and bring it to a cooking oil recycling location or special event. Sites only accept liquid, vegetable-based cooking oil – no animal fats (i.e., those solid at room temperature).

Thanks to a grant from the DuPage Foundation, SCARCE has been able to help communities establish permanent cooking oil collection sites. Contact the Wood Dale Public Works Department for more information at 630-350-3530.

SNOW REMOVAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

The City of Wood Dale has initiated a Snow Removal Assistance Program to assist those in the community that need help with snow removal and do not have the means to complete it on their own. The program will be limited based on available funds and a first-come, first-served basis for those who qualify.

ABOUT THE PROGRAM:

The City has obtained a private contractor to fulfill the services specified in this program. The City will subsidize the cost per visit at fifty percent based on your property's snow removal needs. Participants must meet the criteria set forth


below to qualify for participation. Snow removal services will be initiated when two inches of snow has fallen. The contractor will be directed to wait until the storm is complete to begin the snow removal work. It may take several hours before your property has been completed. The contractor may need to make repeated trips to the residence with heavy snow accumulation. This extra assistance will result in further charges for those services.

The services include:

- Removal of snow from hardscape at the front or side of corner of the property.
- No salting or deicer will be used.

The City of Wood Dale Public Works Department, has its snow removal equipment ready to keep the City's streets clear for another winter. With everyone doing their part, snow removal can be completed in a timely manner. The faster the roads are cleared of snow, the sooner Fire and Police personnel have unhampered access to homes and businesses in case of an emergency.

- Parking on streets forty-eight (48) hours following 2" or more of snowfall is prohibited.
- Snow shoveled or plowed from driveways should be placed on the parkway, not the street. Throwing snow back on the road is a traffic hazard, which is against the law. Be courteous to your neighbors by clearing snow from the sidewalk in front of your home. Children would like to utilize the sidewalks to avoid the additional hazards of walking in the streets during snowy weather.
- Please do not deposit snow on or around fire hydrants. Keep the area clear in case of a Fire emergency.
- Please understand that there are over 4,000 driveways in Wood Dale. It is not possible to clear each driveway after plowing your street. To help prevent the plow from dumping unnecessary amounts of snow in your driveway, always shovel or blow the snow to the left of your driveway unless your driveway abuts your neighbor's driveway, then refrain from depositing snow anywhere other than your property.
- The City has established a priority plowing system and snow removal routes. The main streets in the community will be cleared first, followed by local streets, culde-sacs, alleys, and sidewalks on State and County roads, in that order.
- The City will not plow private streets and parking areas in multi-family unit developments or private roads in industrial areas.

FROZEN PIPES

What are some common reasons for frozen pipes?

Water pipes will usually be more susceptible to freezing when the outdoor air temperature is below freezing for more than a few days. Special attention should be given when the outdoor air temperature does not rise above zero degrees during the daytime hours.

Some reasons include:

- 1. Unheated basement where the water meter and pipes are located.
- 2. Un-insulated pipes which are against outside walls.
- 3. Open windows near the water meters or pipes.
- 4. Openings or cracks which allow cold outside air near the water meter or pipes.
- 5. Water meter or pipes enclosed or boxed in against the outside wall.

How do I know if my pipes are frozen?

Generally, when a pipe that feeds a certain fixture such as a shower, sink, or toilet freezes, you will no longer be able to get water through that fixture. This will be the case if the pipe is frozen solid.

Why do frozen water pipes break?

When water freezes within a pipe, the volume of the water expands. The same amount of water takes up more space as a solid than a liquid. This causes the pipes to expand and possibly break at a weak point. This may not be noticed immediately. However, the pipes may thaw from the inside-out with the pipe actually breaking only when the full water pressure is restored.

Do only pipes inside the house freeze?

No. Not only is your inside plumbing susceptible to freezing, but your water service could also be subject to freezing. This is caused by frost in the ground encasing your service in ice, thereby freezing your service. This is especially typical of shallow (less than five feet deep) services.

What is a water service?

Water service is a pipe that begins with a connection to the water main in the city right-of-way. This pipe was designed solely to deliver fresh water to your home plumbing fixtures (i.e., sinks, toilets, showers, etc.) This line has valves on it to allow your water to be turned on or off.

Where are my shutoff valves?

There are actually two major shutoff valves in line with your service. The first valve, called a curb stop, is generally located in the parkway and is normally housed by a cylinder with a cap on it called the Buffalo Box or "B Box" for short. The other major valve is located in the home next to the water meter. Other valves may be near plumbing appliances such as sinks and toilets.

Should I maintain my main shutoff valve?

Keeping your main valve in good working condition will assure you that you can turn your water off in the event of an emergency, in case one of your water pipes break, for example. Olderstyle gate valves should be turned periodically due to possible corrosion build-up. Newer Teflon-coated ball valves should stay in working order without any regular turning.

What should I do if my pipes freeze?

If your pipes freeze, there are some procedures that you can follow to thaw them. The quicker that the problem is recognized, the better chance that damage will be minimized.

Some techniques for thawing frozen pipes include:

- 1. If possible, expose a boxed-in area to the inside heat. An example includes opening some ceiling tiles if your home has a drop ceiling.
- 2. Use a hair dryer.
- 3. DO NOT use torches to thaw pipes!
- 4. Rubbing the pipes with warm damp rags may slowly thaw the line.

How can I prevent my pipes from freezing?

There are many ways to help prevent your water pipes from freezing in extreme weather.

Some suggestions include:

- 1. Keep the location where the water meter or pipes are exposed heated.
- 2. Providing ventilation to pipes allowing warmer air to circulate around them.
- 3. Insulating your pipes.
- 4. Caulking and sealing any openings near your water pipes.
- Keeping some tap water running. (Moving water is more difficult to freeze, understanding, however, this will affect your bill.)
- 6. In severe cases, it is best to turn your main valve off and drain your system by turning your sinks on. This way, there will be no water in your pipes to freeze. Even if your pipes have not frozen in the past, severe cold can cause electricity blackouts and thereby disable your furnace. Your home can then become closer to the outdoor temperature very quickly. Draining your system will ensure that your pipes do not freeze. This is normally done if no one will be home for an extended period in extreme weather.

ATTENTION: RESIDENTIAL, COMMERCIAL & INDUSTRIAL WITH BACKFLOW DEVICES

These devices should be checked and maintained annually.

Oakbrook School Partners with Diverse Populations and Families

Once again this year, some Oakbrook School classrooms are partnering with Child's Voice school for children with hearing loss. In October, Ms. Louie's Kindergarten, Mrs. Kwilos's First Grade, and Mrs. Ruscitti's Second Grade classes went to Child's Voice (CV) school to learn about hearing loss and how students in the school learn. Oakbrook students also had time to ask questions about different hearing aides and enjoyed sharing some playtime in the CV playground. Approximately once a month thereafter, children from Child's Voice school will visit their Oakbrook grade level counterpart classrooms. CV students participate in the same lessons as Oakbrook students. In this way, children with hearing loss experience learning in a typical public school setting. This partnership offers an opportunity for children to learn about and accept differences of others, making this a great practice to support our school's social and emotional instructional goals.

Also this year, Wood Dale School District 7 is once again implementing the Home Visits program. Last year, several Oakbrook School teachers participated in the program. Through the program each teacher attempts to arrange at least one home visit with every child in their classroom. The visits are informal, with times agreed upon by both the family and the teacher. We have received positive feedback about the program from teachers, parents, and students. Families appreciate meeting teachers in a non-academic setting where they can have rich conversations about their children and how to best support them in school. Students report how fun it is to have their teacher in their home to show them aspects of their lives. These meetings go a long way in supporting students' social and emotional needs, and building communication and trust between the school and families.

- Complete 90% of the 10 Year Life Safety Priority List by the end of FY24.
- Increase efficiency of district document management through the expanded use of digital technology.
- Complete selected projects from the operations & maintenance plan, to ensure an engaging and safe learning environment for all students and staff.

These goals will drive the work of the Board, administration, teachers, and staff throughout the 2023/24 school year. 
BOOK CLUBS


Mystery Lovers' Book Club A Christmas Candy Killing by Christina Romeril

band, written as an oral history, is chronicled in this riveting novel.


