Spend the day with us at Open House Chicago on Sunday, October 15! OHC is an annual event when landmark buildings throughout the city open their doors to the public. The Wood Dale Public Library and Bensenville Community Public Library are co-sponsoring free, all-day walking tours of the Chicago Loop and the University of Chicago's south side campus.
