### Happy New Year, Wood Dale!

When the clock strikes midnight on January 1 each year, I always feel a wave of hope and curiosity for what the new year will bring. Before we can look forward, though, it's important to reflect on the milestones, accomplishments, and journeys that led to this moment.

Looking back, we introduced or updated several new services, collections, and programs in 2023. Did you know you can send faxes from the library for free? During a recent equipment upgrade, we launched a new scan-to-fax service and removed the barrier of charging for this feature. With the same equipment, you can touch up images, translate text, and scan to email.

For some of our youngest learners, and thanks to a federal grant, we introduced Launchpads. These self-contained tablets include learning games with subjects ranging from language learning to STEAM topics. These devices break down technology barriers because their content is preloaded, accessible without internet access, and all you need is your Wood Dale Public Library card to check them out.

Finally, and again thanks to grant funding, we have acquired virtual reality (VR) headsets, cameras, and software to help students experience this technology and learn how to create their own VR projects. Once we have fulfilled the requirements of the grant, this technology will become available to patrons of all ages to experience.

As we look toward the future, I hope you'll stop by the library to see how we can help. Whether you're a bookworm, a tech enthusiast, a curious learner, or someone just seeking a guiet space to unwind, your library is also your community hub.
